How do we obtain your personal data?

Sometimes you give us your personal data, sometimes your personal data is collected automatically.

- We gather personal data about you when you give it to us or interact with us directly. [e.g. as part of our business acceptance processes, in the course of and in connection with our services, when you register for a training, workshop or event]
- A number of facilities on our website such as the contact form and call-to-actions invite you to give us your personal data. The purpose of these facilities is apparent at the point that you give us your personal data. We only use your data for those purposes.
- We collect your personal data while monitoring (1) our software tools such as our marketing automation tools, (2) our website and (3) our email communications.



Which are the legal grounds for using your personal data?

Data protection legislation requires that we need to have a legal ground for collecting and processing your personal data. We collect and process your personal data on the following legal grounds:

- **Your consent**
You have given us clear consent to process your personal data for specific purposes. You can freely withdraw such consent at any time.
[e.g. to keep you posted about new training programmes or workshops, to receive our blog posts]
- **Necessary for a contract**
We may need to process your personal data to establish, perform and terminate a contract for the provision of our services or because you have asked us to fulfil certain requests prior to contract conclusion.
[e.g. to prepare a pitch]
- **Legitimate interests**
We process your personal data because we have a legitimate interest to do so. In general, our legitimate interests will relate to:
 - the delivery, improvement and development of our services and business operations
 - the promotion of our services including direct marketing
 - gaining insights from your behaviour on our website
 - the personalisation of our communications
- **Legal obligations**
We may need to process your personal data because of legal obligations to which we are subject.
[e.g. to comply with tax obligations]

How long do we keep your personal data?

We keep your personal data in accordance with the applicable data protection laws and the purposes for which the data is collected and used.



With whom do we share your personal data?

We may share your personal data with certain trusted third parties. These third parties may include:

- external service providers
[e.g. hosting service providers, IT service providers, business service providers, bank and financial institutions, accountants, catering service providers]
- government authorities



We do not sell, distribute or otherwise make your personal data commercially available to any third party.



We use cookies

What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that are stored in your web browser or mobile application.

Why do we use cookies?

We use cookies on our website so that we can (1) keep track of your choices and preferences (e.g. language choice), and (2) improve the use of our website.

How does it work?

Once a cookie is stored and you visit our website again, the data stored in that cookie notifies our website. The cookie recognises you and tells our website your last activity on our website.

Cookies usually also have an expiration date. For example, some cookies are automatically deleted when you close your browser (so-called session cookies), while others can be stored longer on your computer, sometimes until you delete them manually (so-called permanent cookies).

We also use third party cookies

We also use third party cookies such as from Google Analytics. We rely on Google Analytics cookies to improve (1) the functionality and user-friendliness of our website, and (2) our services. Google Analytics gives us aggregated statistical data about your use of our website. This includes details such as page views, source and time spent on our website. This information is depersonalised and is displayed as numbers. This means that it cannot be tracked back to individuals.

Cookies placed by social media

What are your rights?

- Right to access your personal data
You have the right to access your personal data. This includes the right to ask us supplementary information about e.g. the categories of data we process and the purposes of data processing.
- Right to correct your personal data
You have the right to correct and complete your personal data, and to have recipients to whom your personal data was given informed of the rectification.
- Right to be "forgotten"
In certain circumstances, you can ask us to erase any personal data we hold about you.
- Right to port your personal data to another data controller
In certain circumstances, you have the right to be given your personal data. If you ask us, we will directly transfer your personal data to another data controller.
- Right to restriction of processing your personal data
In certain circumstances, you have the right to obtain restriction of the processing of your personal data.
- Right to object the processing of your personal data
You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data based on our legitimate interests. You can ask us not to use your personal data for direct marketing at all times.

- Right to withdraw your consent
If the processing of your personal data is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.
- Right to object to automated individual decision-making including profiling
In the case of automated individual decision-making such as when we send you personalised emails based on your behaviour, you have the right to obtain human intervention, give your point of view, receive an explanation for the automated decision, and challenge that decision.
- Right to lodge a complaint

List of necessary cookies

XSRF-TOKEN	1 hour	A token	Contains a unique token that is sent with every request to prevent CSRF (Cross Site Request Forgery).

List of functional cookies

Functional cookies are used to recognise users when they return to our website. They enable the personalisation of content and the recognition of users, and they remember user preferences (e.g. choice of language). It is not possible to refuse these cookies if you want to surf on our website.

Name	Expiry date	Content	Purpose
showCookieNotice	1 year	0 or 1	Is set to 1 if the user clicks on "Agree" at the bottom of the website. From then on the cookie bar is no longer displayed on the following page requests.
laravel_session	1 hour	A token	Contains a unique token that is kept between requests, to be able to pass on information to the user uniquely from page to page. This is standard logic, which is currently not used to transmit functional data.

List of analytical cookies

Analytical cookies are used to track visitors on our website. How do they browse, how long are they staying, what are they looking at, etc. They are used to measure the performance of our website and to optimise it. You can decline these cookies.
